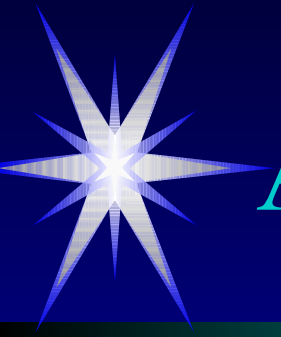

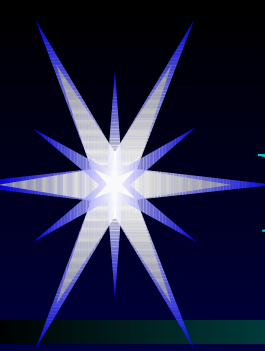

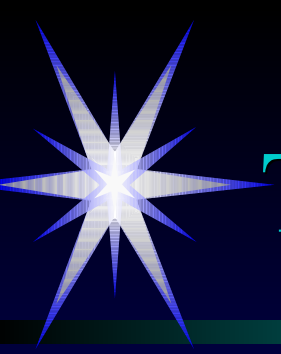
# Nebuchadnezzar's Dream (Dan. 2)

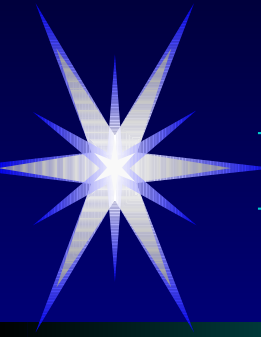
# Timing

– Dan. 2:44

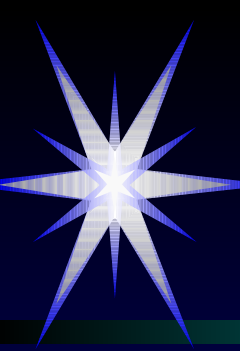

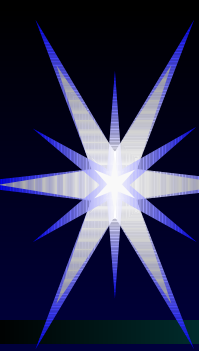
## B. The Beasts: Daniel 7

- ▶ Ten-horned (7)

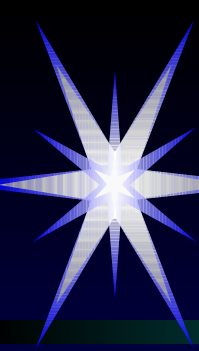
## Kingdoms

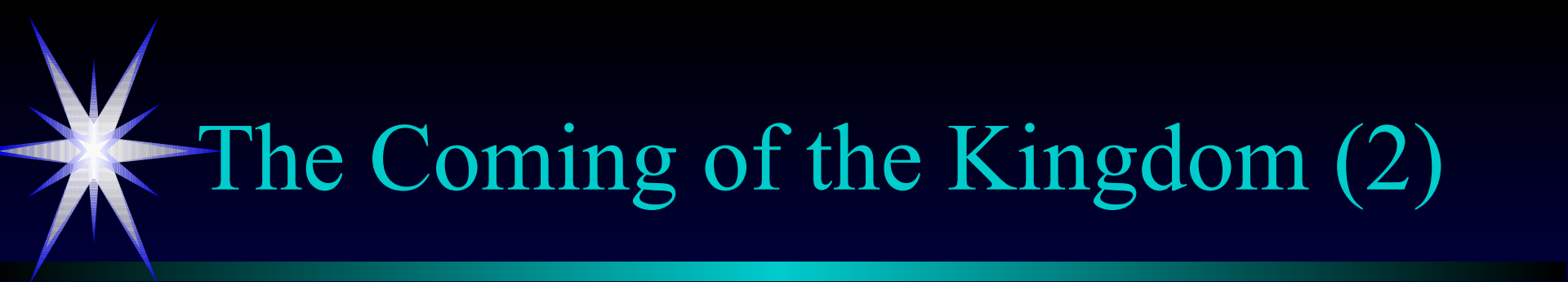
# The Coming of the Kingdom

– Matt. 12:28



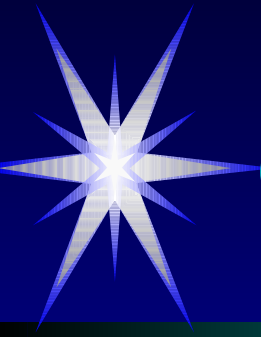
# The Coming of the Kingdom (2)

– Rom. 14:17

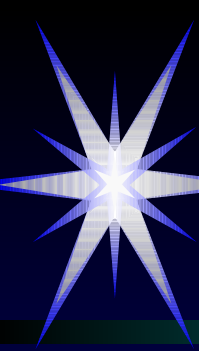


# Jeremiah and Daniel's 70

In the first year of his reign, I, Daniel, perceived in the books the number of years that, according to the word of the LORD to Jeremiah the prophet, must pass before the end of the desolations of Jerusalem, namely, seventy years.

– Dan. 9:2

This whole land shall become a ruin and a waste, and these nations shall serve the king of Babylon seventy years.

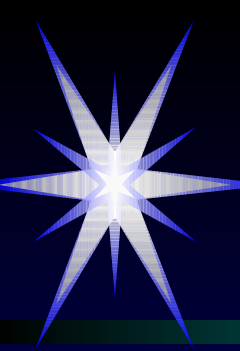

# Sabbatical Years

He took into exile in Babylon those who had escaped from the sword, and they became servants to him and to his sons until the establishment of the kingdom of Persia, to fulfill the word of the LORD by the mouth of Jeremiah, until the land had enjoyed its Sabbaths. All the days that it lay desolate it kept Sabbath, to fulfill seventy years.

– 2 Chron. 36:20-21



# Significance of the 70 years

- ▶ Each year of 70 years of exile is a sabbath
- ▶ One sabbath represents 7 total years
- ▶ Total years represented,  $7 \times 70 = 70$  sevens

A larger pattern



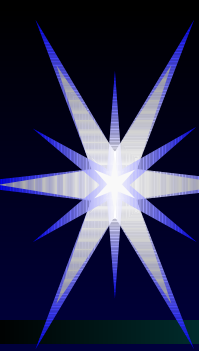


# Seventy Weeks

"Seventy weeks are decreed about your people and your holy city, to finish the transgression, to put an end to sin, and to atone for iniquity, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal both vision and prophet, and to anoint a most holy place.

– Dan. 9:24

"Seventy weeks" = "70 sevens."

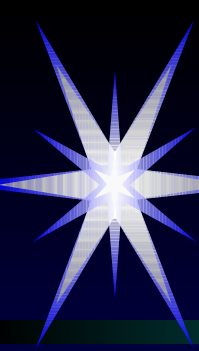


# Symbol of the Sabbath

So then, there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God, for whoever has entered God's rest has also rested from his works as God did from his. Let us therefore strive to enter that rest, so that no one may fall by the same sort of disobedience.

– Heb. 4:9-11





# Sabbath Patterns

- ▶ Seventh day
- ▶ Seventh month (Feast of tabernacles)
- ▶ Seventh year ("sabbath year")
- ▶ 50<sup>th</sup> year ("jubilee"; Lev. 25)
- ▶ 70 "weeks": 10 jubilees, leading to consummation

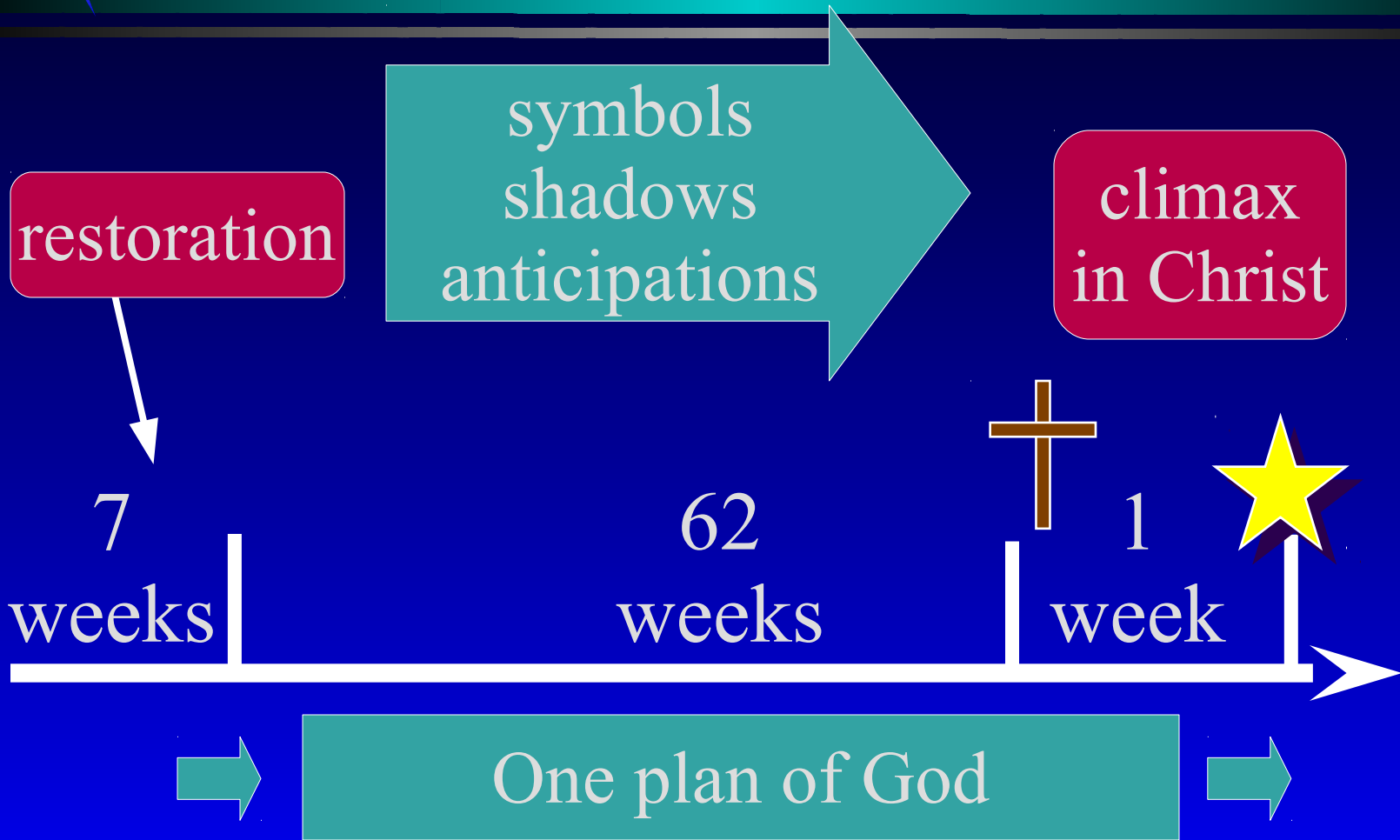
70 sevens are 10 jubilees,  
490 symbolical years

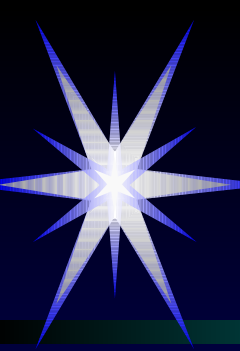

# Divisions of the 70 Weeks (9:24-27)



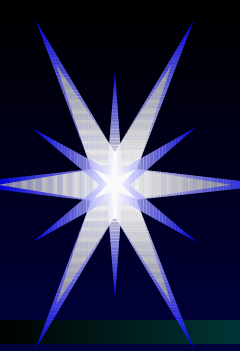

off and shall have nothing.

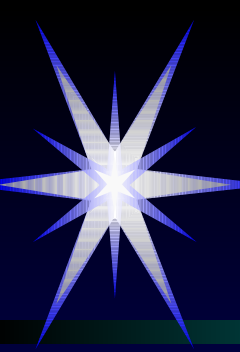

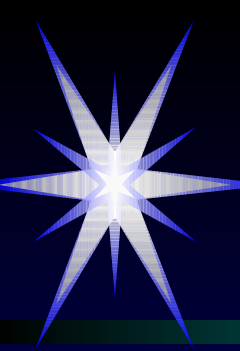

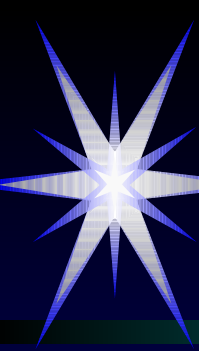


# Structure of 70 Weeks

- ▶ End week
- ▶ Preliminary
- ▶ Leading to fulfillment
- ▶ Inaugurated
  - ▶ new covenant
- ▶ destruction of Jerusalem
- ▶ consummation (new heaven and new earth)
